Eileen Wyant taught at Diamond Path for 15 years as a Title 1, Learning Disabilities and classroom teacher in 2nd and 3rd grades (1986-2001). She loved people, especially children, and learning. She had a passion and expertise in mathematics education, in particular, and shared that expertise through training with educators throughout our district and the state. She was thoughtful, compassionate, wise and fun.

Bonnie Parker taught at Diamond Path for 10 years in kindergarten, 2nd and 3rd grades (1986-1996). She, too, enjoyed people, especially children, and learning. She loved reading, music, sign language and good jokes. She had a master's degree in counseling, which she pursued because of her compassion for children who were struggling. She had a wonderful sense of humor and unique ability to relate to others.

Barbara Browder taught at Diamond Path for 15 years in kindergarten, Reading Recovery and Basic Skills (1989-2004). She loved to instill the joy of books and reading in children. She had a special interest in working with children who were English Language Learners. The last several years she rode her scooter in school which allowed her to move easily through the halls. Even though her health was fragile, her strength inspired all of us.

- Have attended Diamond Path Elementary for two or more years
- Plan on entering a post high school educational program

How have you or do you plan to make a difference in your school or community? What are your educational and career goals? How do you plan to reach those goals?
 - b. A letter of recommendation from a teacher, clergy, employer, community service advisor, etc.
 - c. A current high school transcript
